PSOJ President Peter Moses accepted the Prime Minister's invitation to chair a Committee charged with the responsibility of a) reviewing the proposed gas tax and b) considering a possible rollback. The Committee members, undaunted by this important national assignment, rose to the challenge and were able to successfully complete the task within the specified time frame. As a result, the country benefited from a 44% rollback in this tax. The Committee did almost all of its work here at the PSOJ and was supported in its work by the staff of the Secretariat and the Chairman of the Economic Policy Committee. Congratulations to all who were members of the committee or who supported their work in any way.
