WTO/KICK OFF TR@DE NET

he PSOJ Secretariat hosted the International Trade Centre's Kick - Off Meeting Re: World Tr@de Net' on April 5-6 2001. The UNC-TAD / WTO's ITC is the focal point in the United Nations system for technical cooperation with developing countries in trade promotion and was created by the General Agreement on Tariffs and Trade (GATT) in 1964 and since 1968 has been operated jointly by the WTO and the UN, the latter acting through the United Nations Conference on Trade and Development (UNCTAD). As an executing agency of the United Nations Development Programme (UNDP), ITC is directly responsible for implementing UNDP-financed projects in developing countries and economies in transition with the aim of expanding the countries'

exports and improving import operations. With a clear business perspective on the WTO agreements and their implications, "World Tr@de Net" information keeps the business communities in developing countries and transitional economies up to date on the evolving world trading system.
