One of the first initiatives will be a call-in session, to be held on Thursday, 13<sup>th</sup> June, 2002 at the PSOJ office.

PSOJ President, Oliver F. Clarke, says, “This is a very important first step in our campaign to encourage greater collaboration between private citizens and the police. This is saying very clearly to Jamaicans that the police force is working towards greater accountability and transparency. The public should, therefore, start giving their support to the law enforcement agencies in their fight against crime and drugs”.

The “Phone-In” is expected to be repeated on a monthly basis, with different guests each month.

The PSOJ encourages the public to participate in this programme by calling in, asking questions, providing information and suggestions – “Make the call – You can make a difference”.
